English II focuses on **world literature**, expanding students' understanding of global perspectives, themes, and voices. Through a variety of texts — including short stories, novels, plays, and informational texts — students will strengthen their reading comprehension, writing, speaking, and listening skills. Emphasis is placed on **analytical and expository writing**, **research**, and preparation for the **STAAR English II End-of-Course Exam** (if applicable).

- 6. Prepare for the English II EOC exam and advanced English coursework.
